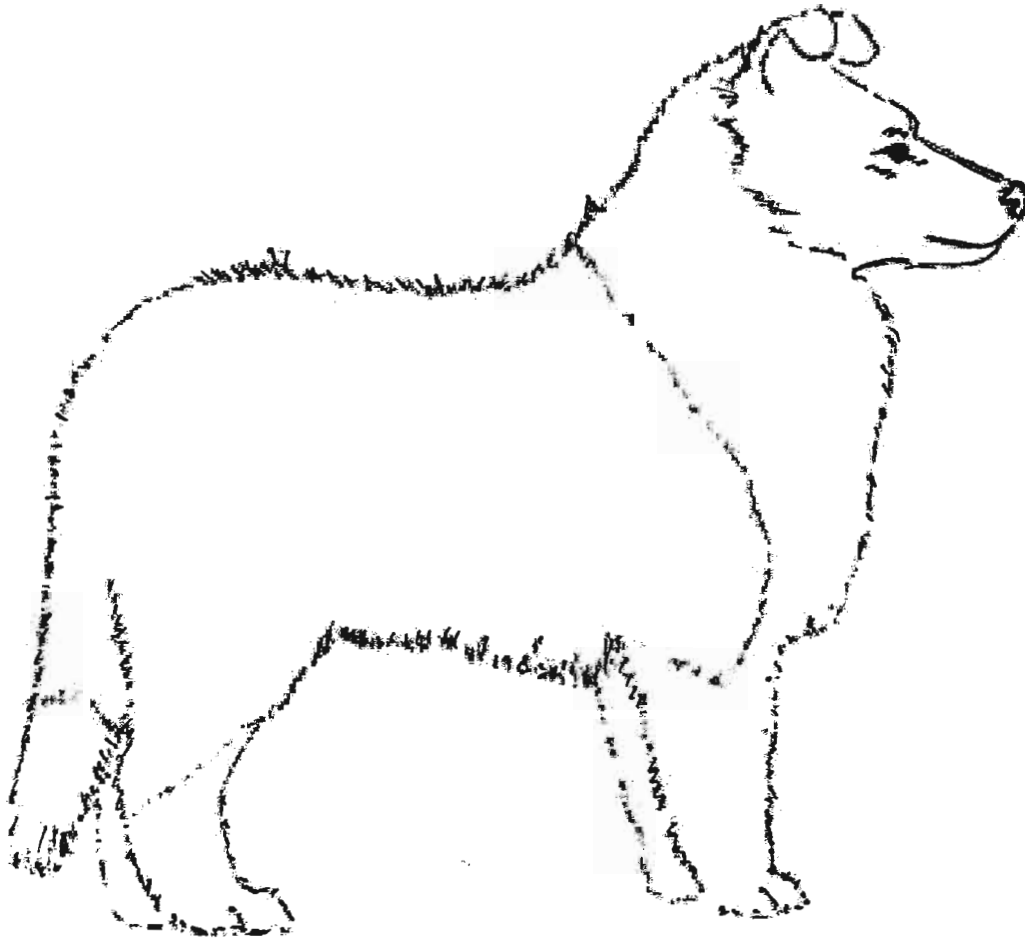

An early start in socialization gives young shelties the confidence they need and will last a lifetime! Above all, make your sheltie feel "special"!

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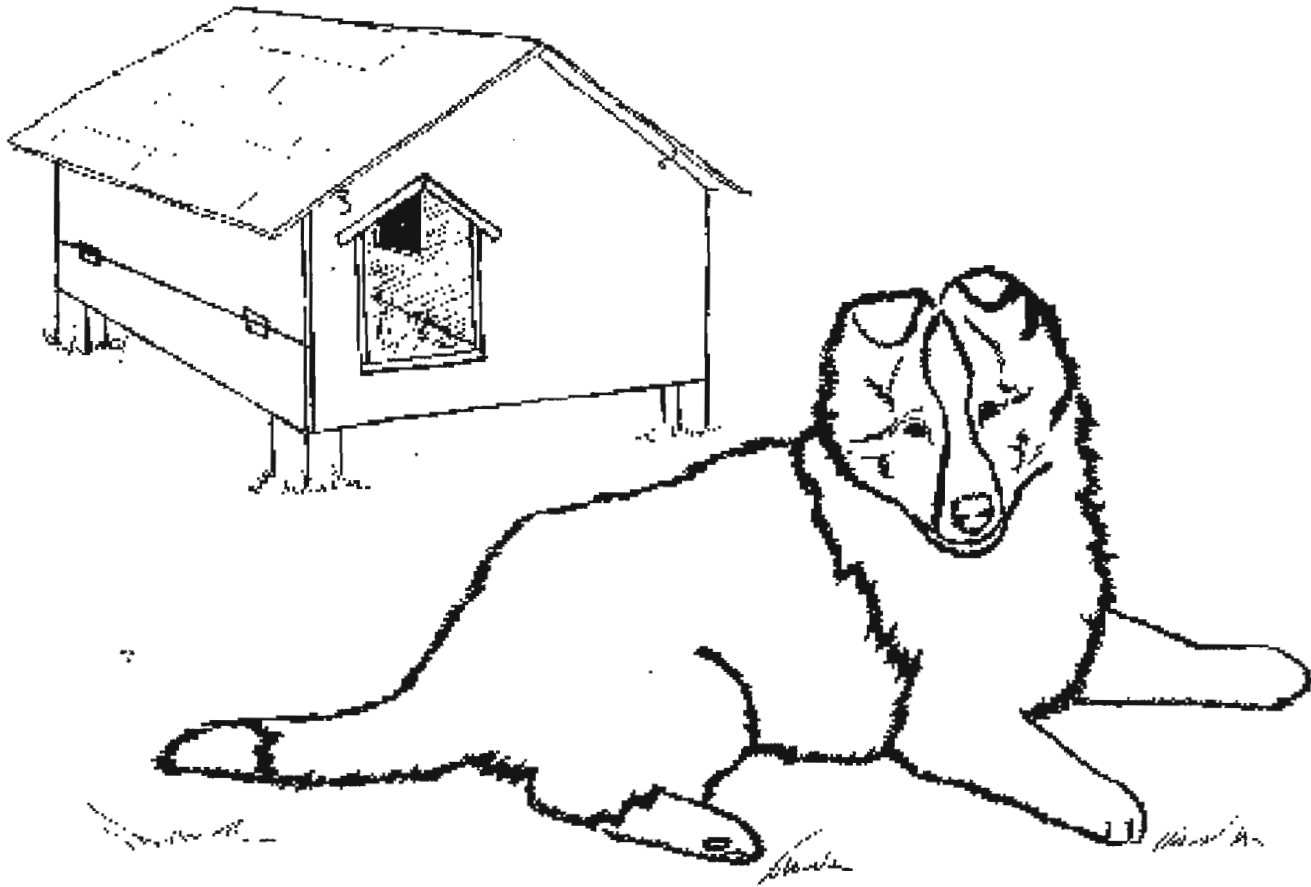

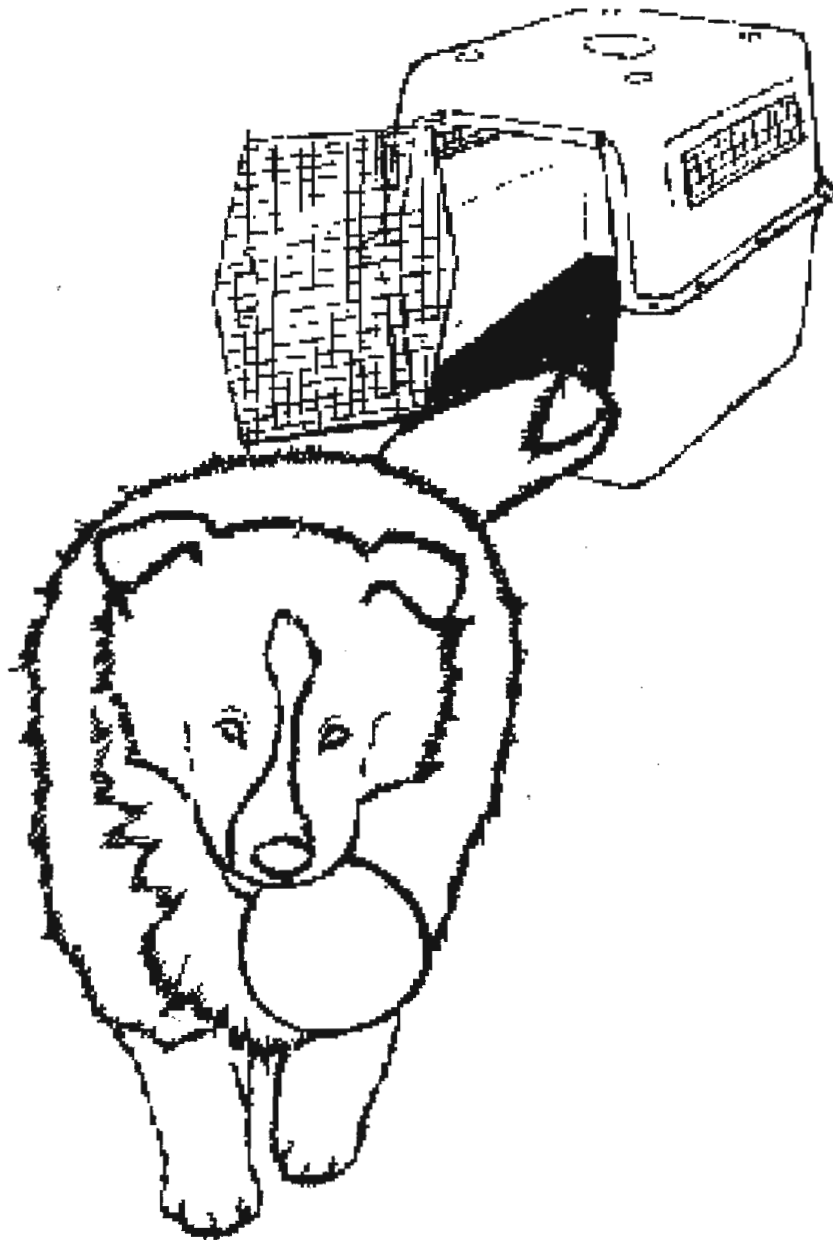


Herding Instinct is a strong desire in many shelties and the sport is growing among fanciers!!

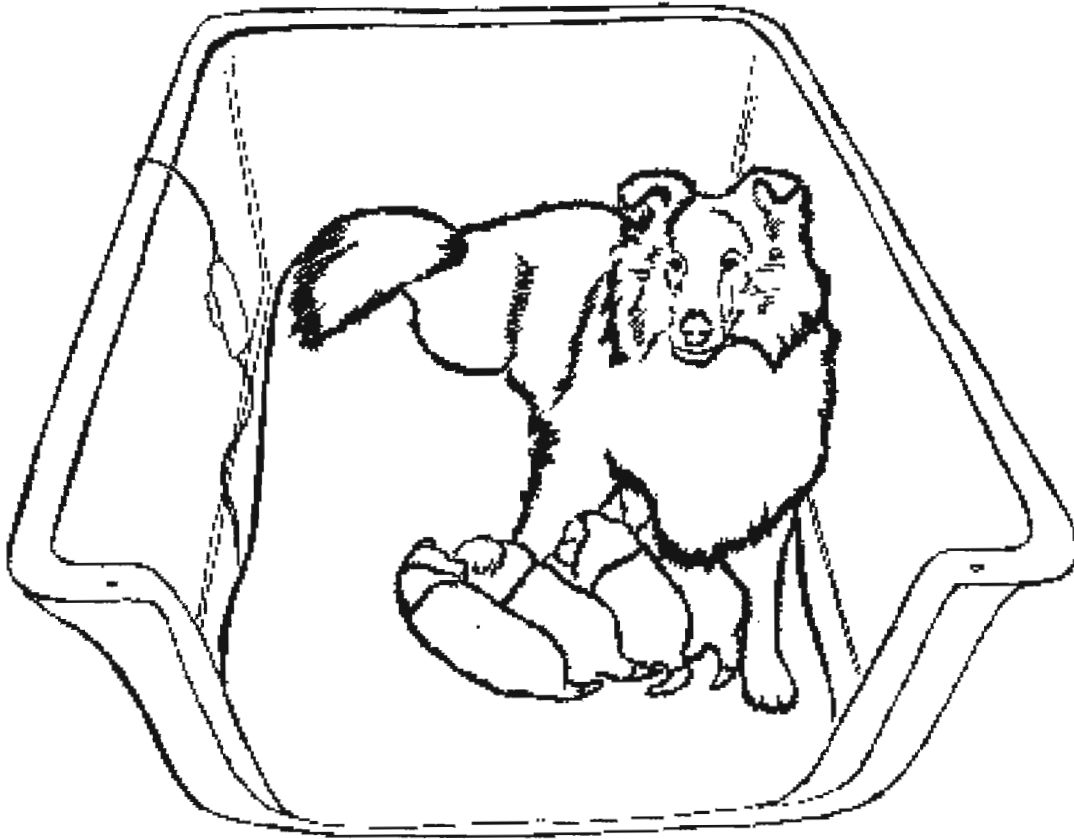




In the scent discrimination exercise, this advanced obedience sheltie must locate and return the correct article with his handler's scent.



A crate can be a great investment for your Sheltie. It aides in housebreaking, gives the dog a secure place to stay when he's left alone for a short period, is a safe means of travel in a vehicle, and is his nighttime bed!

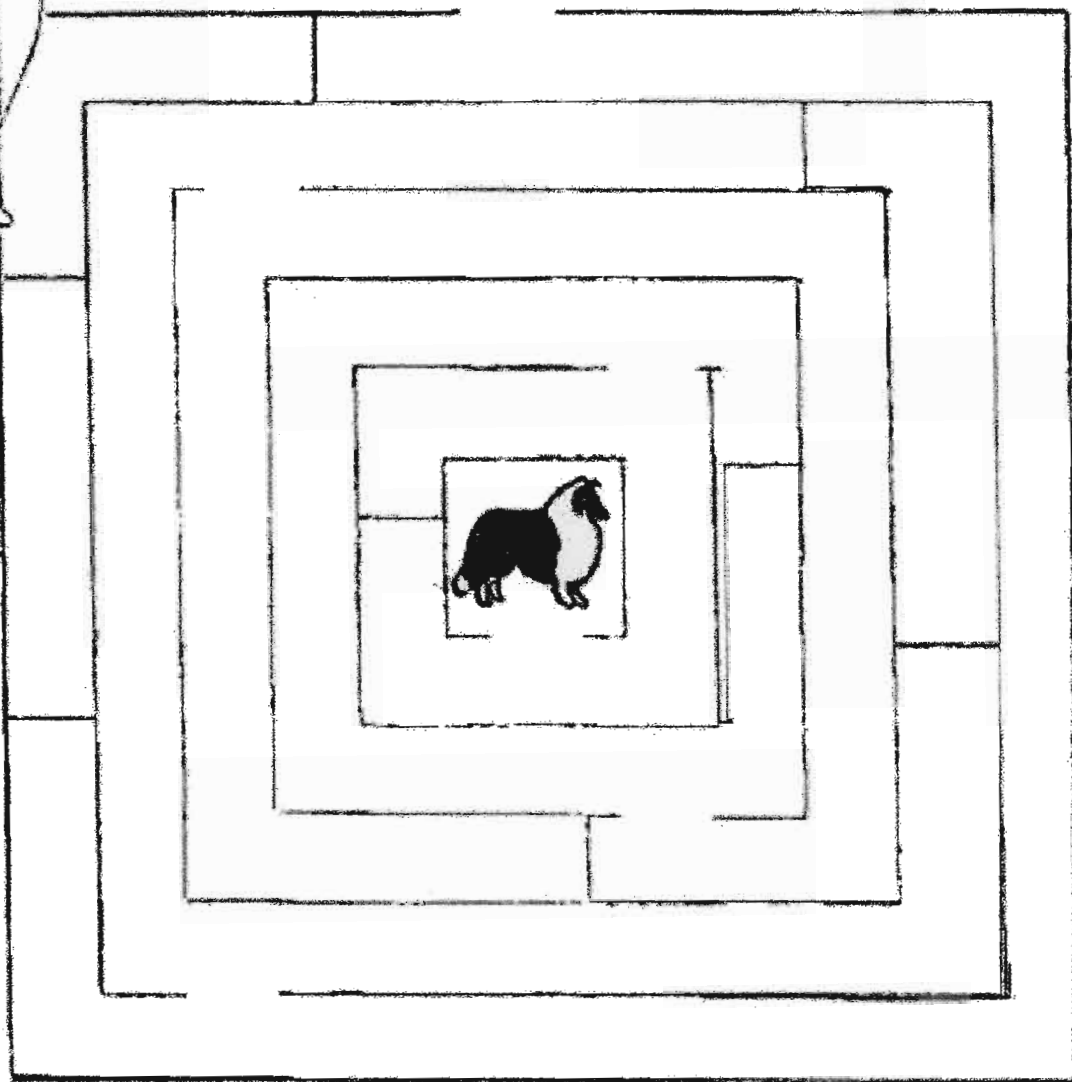


Raising purebred litters of Shelties is best left to those breeders dedicated to improving the breed. Years of experience are necessary to decide which stud dog would best compliment the brood bitch.

Tests clearing the parents for a variety of inherited problems are necessary. Both parents should have excellent temperaments. The costs involved in planning and raising a litter usually exceeds any profit for the breeder.

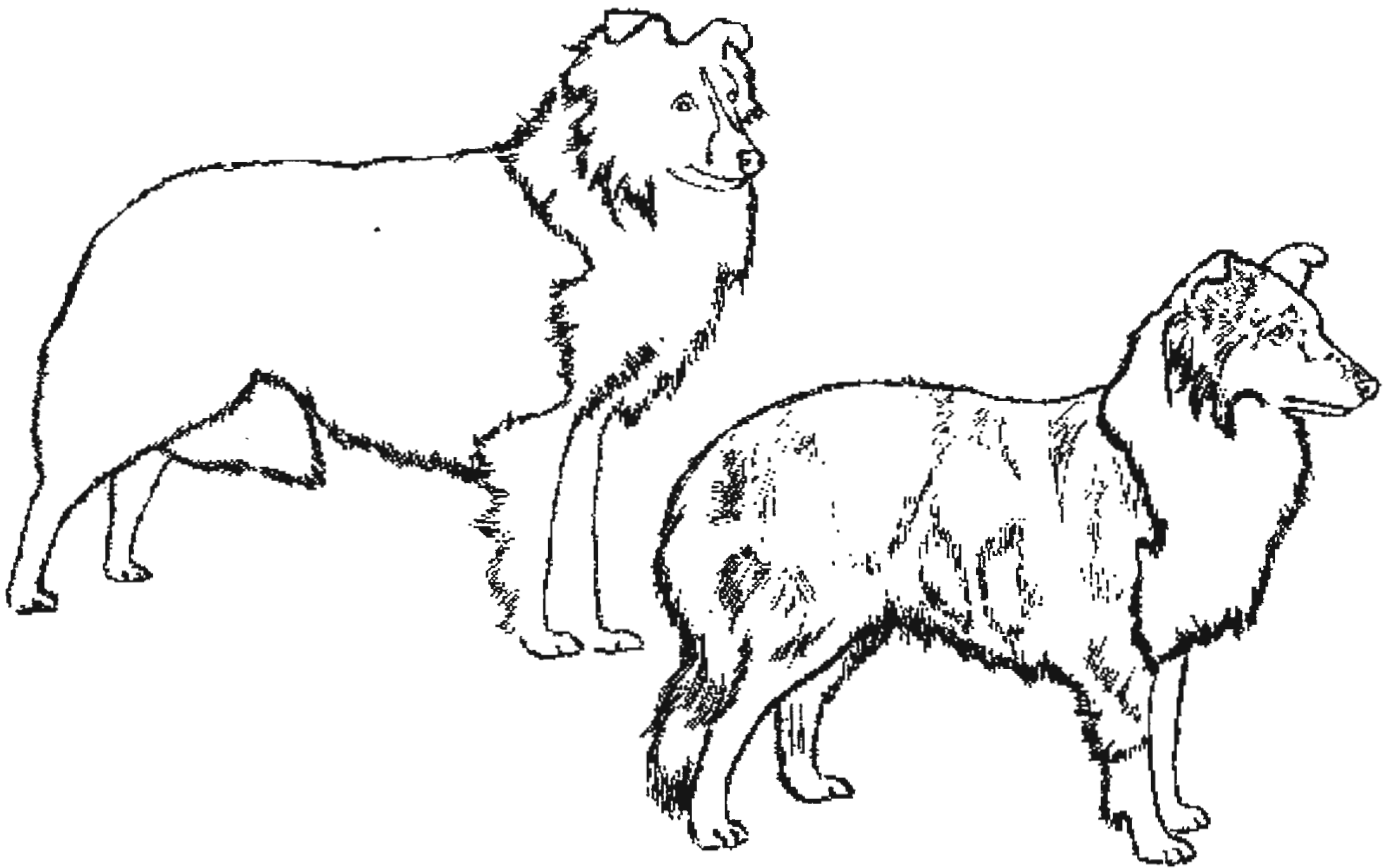




Junior Showmanship classes allow youth to compete at their own level and age group. Many will go on as their talents progress to be top breeder/handlers.
